This baby and her mom arrived at our JIT campus in Barabanki during our India Health Initiative (IHI) program. This program receives thousands of patients within a span of one week who travel from far away by rickshaw, foot and/or bike just to be seen by a doctor at no cost.

This child was severely malnourished and suffered from diarrhea. "A few more days and it could have been fatal," said a volunteer for the IHI Program, Dr. John Rosenberg. "Now, because of our treatment and supplementary feeding, she'll be OK." Insha'Allah.

We know what it takes to feed, care and help save a person's life. It's not complicated nor costly. What it takes is the refusal to tolerate the needless circumstances of millions of poverty struck minorities and Muslims in India, and the collective will to act.

Each campaign addresses an area of need and shows what is possible when we work together with others. EMPOWERING THE YOUTH

New! Plans for 10 Skill Development Centers

In line with our goal to provide education and assistance for children, IMRC with the Government of Bihar, plans to empower the youth by providing them with skills for employment and establish a wide network of training centers. Youth will be trained at these centers in three main courses: Life Skills, Communications Skills (English & Hindi) and Basic Computer Literacy. Each course will focus on speaking, listening, understanding, reading and writing in English and Hindi.

This program is for youth in grades 10-12 that may have dropped out and need another chance to learn a skill or for current students who want to supplement their existing coursework, Insha'Allah.

IMRC's role in this project is to provide the equipment and trained staff for the centers. The infrastructure will be provided by the Government of Bihar.

Each location will need:

- 1 Center Coordinator
- 1 Certified Faculty
- 1 System Administrator
- 1 Counselor (Bilingual in Hindi & English)





Program Highlights

Accommodations

Each center will have two shifts of morning and evening programs. Each shift can take up to 40 students.

Costs

Updated! Sponsor for a center for \$16,500. \$165,000 is needed to establish 10 centers.

Goals

Our goal is to train 6,000 students in 5 years across 10 centers in Bihar.

Locations

IMRC selected 10 Muslim minority concentrated Districts (MCDs) and was awarded 10 Centers by the Government of Bihar.

EMPOWERING THE YOUTH

New! Challenger Civil Services Academy

This program launched in June 2016. Every year the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducts the Civil Services examination across India to select about 1,000 candidates to serve in various wings of the administration in Central and State Governments.

This academy will provide precise study material prepared by experts in the field, focusing on priority areas from an examination point of view in classroom teaching to model examinations on UPSC pattern. It's a three-tier integrated course which can prepare students for the Indian Administrative Services and other civil service exams.

The academy offers experienced faculty (including former IAS officers), stateof-the-art classrooms and designed coursework aimed to prepare students for success!







Program Highlights

Purpose

IMRC believes that by getting involved in public sectors of the government, you can provide input and influence in decisions for minorities and Muslims across India. This program was created to guide and prepare students to become strong leaders and help bring about change.

Main Building

The main building's construction is now complete. The Conference Center opened in February 2017. (shown above)

Next Steps

Build a 4 story hostel building - \$600,000 Cost for each floor of the hostel - \$150,000 Sponsor a student at CCSA for \$3000/year

COMMITMENT TO HEALTHCARE

Accessible Affordable Preventative


IMRC focuses on providing accessible and affordable healthcare to communities in rural areas. We help deliver care in the most challenging and often remote places such as slums, ghettos, and villages. We respond rapidly with lifesaving care in times of crisis such as natural disasters and communal conflicts.

To meet the needs of the community, the Women and Children's clinic was extended into a multi-specialty hospital with 100 in-patient beds. Since its inauguration in 2010, each year we have expanded and now have a Department of Cardiology, Gastroenterology, ICU, Laparoscopic Surgery, Neurology, Neurosurgery and Obstetrics.

INDIA HEALTH INITIATIVE

To further address the needs of the sick, IMRC launched the India Health Initiative program in 2010. A medical team from the U.S. donates their time (1-3 weeks) along with a medical team in India to provide healthcare, health education, preventive care and technical training for local doctors. In February 2017, we just completed our 8th year. Each year, Alhamdulillah, we've been able to serve approximately 5,000-10,000 patients through this program. 70% of India's population live in rural areas and have limited or no access at all to hospitals and clinics.





EXPANDING HEALTHCARE PROGRAMS

Training and Educating Professionals

Our Indo-US Hospital has been open for six years now. The five story hospital building focuses on providing healthcare for diabetes and other related illnesses. However, treatment is only part of the solution.

Now we are starting to expand the hospital facility with a 6th floor to accomodate classrooms and educational material. We plan to offer vocational and certificate courses including:

- Critical & Healthcare Management
- Emergency Medical Technology
- Emergency & Dialysis Technician
- Lab Technician

FEEDING PROGRAM: RAMADAN & QURBANI

The happiest moments



Our largest campaign is the Feeding Program which we run annually in Ramadan and in time for Eid ul Adha. As communities worldwide anticipate the joy and blessings of Ramadan and Eid, it is the less fortunate that face further hardships.

Communities across India's slums, villages, and remote areas face poverty on a daily basis wondering where their next meal is going to come from. They're in a situation they cannot change. For a majority of them, they don't have the skills to go out and earn a living to buy food. They are left helpless and rely on our annual support.

With support from our volunteers and team in India, we're able to reach more locations by partnering with other local organizations onsite to distribute grain packages, provide cooked meals, host iftars in villages, and pass out Eid outfits.



In 2016, we were blessed to assist the less fortunate with this program and hit a new record of 600,000 beneficiaries!

PROJECT REED

Rural Education and Economic Development



Project REED is an approach to educate rural communities about Islam and provide proper infrastructure for communities to come together to learn, practice and implement their deen. Twelve years later and we're nearly at 100 sites! We now have 91 complete and 5 more in progress. We've come a long way with this project that first began in 2009. We initially proposed building 50 Project REED sites, but due to your generosity we increased the goal to 100 sites.

This shows that if we want to meet our goals of providing real solutions to rural communities and make it a top priority for our brothers and sisters, it can be done.

With each school/masjid that you sponsored, an entire community benefited and generations of families will too. Communities gather for regular halaqas, salah, jummah prayers, and now Ramadan and Eid is always a highlight of the year. Each month we are given reports of the sites and how communities are doing.

A support of \$2000 is needed yearly for each site's operations, maintenance of activities, and Imam's salary.



EMERGENCY RELIEF

South Asia hits top of the list for people facing natural disasters - Forbes



In India, the impact of natural disasters is worsening with extreme weather changes, floods, storms, and earthquakes. Political conflicts are affecting an increasing number of minorities and Muslims as well. IMRC knows that these emergency situations affect rural areas with poor infrastructure, and more often, the women and children hardest.

Our first responders work with vulnerable communities before, during and after emergencies to help save lives, rebuild infrastructures and help families recover. Our goal is to ensure communities are safe, receive aid, are sheltered, healthy, fed, and plan with them for rehabilitation as quickly as possible.

In 2016, we increased our ability to respond to emergencies. We trained staff, stocked emergency kits and supplies, worked with partners to ensure we are able to reach as many victims as possible when an emergency happens.

WATER WELL PROJECT

Where's the nearest water well ? It used to be 3km away.



In 1949, an Environmental Hygiene Committee recommended that safe drinking water should be supplied to 90% of India's population within 40 years. Sixty eight years since the target was set, potable water remains a distant dream in most of rural India. On average, every other woman in rural India travels 107 miles per year just to fetch potable water.

Thanks to your support, this family (shown above) and 431 communities have water wells installed in their area. The unlimited access to a local water source only footsteps away from their home is a luxury itself.



Each rural village is full of gratitude towards the people who have given this amazing gift to their village.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of IMRC as of December 31, 2016, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

For purposes of publishing in the IMRC annual report to its members, we include only a summary of significant income and expenses of the Class Report which are presented on the accrual basis of accounting. The complete December 31, 2016 Audit Report is available upon request.

THE POWER OF YOUR GENEROSITY


Your generosity helped us reach 1 Million people in poverty last year. Your support allowed many things NOT to happen, than happen.


