## Background

Danbir Academy was founded by Sk Saidul Islam, a man who once donated his kidney to a complete stranger. His goal was simple: give children from poor and orphaned backgrounds a real shot at education. Most of the families here cannot afford school fees—some parents work as domestic helpers, some sell items on footpaths, and many survive on daily wages. Without intervention, their children would not be in school.

**Since 2020, IMRC has been supporting 35 orphaned students at Danbir Academy—covering their housing, food, education, and healthcare. There are 147 additional students who benefit from the same school infrastructure, even if they aren't directly sponsored.**

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## JAN-JUNE **HIGHLIGHT**

- **Attendance:** 98% among both day scholars and residents
- **Dropouts:** Zero among IMRC-supported students
- **Academic Improvement:** Avg. score improvement from 48% to 64% over two years
- **5 new orphans admitted without adding financial pressure to their families**
- **On-site healthcare:** Regular weekly camps + emergency care as needed
- **Discipline & routine:** Students follow structured schedules, including Qur'an study, exercise, and general education

# MEET THE STUDENTS YOU SUPPORT

## **Al Habib Mallick – (Grade 7)**

When Al Habib joined, he was addicted to tobacco, bidis, and alcohol—at just 11 years old. His mother was working in fields and houses to feed four kids. Two years later, Al Habib is clean, focused, and consistently scoring above 60%. He's proof that safe shelter and consistent structure can change the course of a child's life.



## **Sk Ranibul – (Grade 8)**

Ranibul lost his father to cancer when he was just a baby. His mother worked in houses and begged to feed her three children. He came to Danbir Academy in Grade 5, unable to even write his name. Today, he studies independently, offers all 5 daily prayers, and recently scored 72% in his semester exams.



## Sk Ashirul (Grade 6) & Arifa Khatun (Grade 4)

These orphaned siblings were left homeless after their father died from a construction accident. Their mother was later forced out of her in-laws' home.

IMRC now supports both children with food, shelter, and education—and their mother now works at the school as a cook. Arifa consistently scores above 80% and dreams of becoming a teacher.

# Next STEPS



## Where They Still Need Our Help

- **Classrooms:** Bamboo-and-tin structures leak in monsoons. Smart TVs and projectors can't be used properly.
- **Space shortage:** Two classes often meet in the mosque or dormitory due to lack of classrooms.
- **Staffing:** We need two more subject teachers for upper-grade Math and Science.
- **Student Kits:** Many students still share shoes or don't have proper bags or uniforms.
- **Top Need:** A weatherproof, brick classroom block.

### Looking Ahead

- Complete a secure classroom block for monsoon-resistant learning
- Expand IMRC-supported orphan slots from 35 to 60 by 2026
- Launch a Career Track program with NEET/JEE/vocational coaching
- Continue medical camps and explore a part-time on-site nurse





***Because of your consistent support, these 35 children now live, study, and eat in safety—and 147 more from the village get access to the same school environment.***


